

Travelling to Ireland and within Ireland

Shannon Airport

Limerick is easily reached by air. Shannon Airport is at the heart of the region and with 200 inbound flights per week, is the easiest way to reach it.

There are scheduled flights, on a year-round basis to and from major cities in Britain, Europe and North America.

Visit Shannon Airport online for specific information on services to/from the airport. Also, note that Cork Airport is less than 90 minutes away.

By Ferry

Limerick is approximately three hours' drive time from Dublin, Dun Laoghaire and Rosslare ferry ports. Fast ferry crossings are available from various UK ports. For specific information on sailing times to and from the relevant Irish ports visit the Irish Ferries website or Stena Line website.

By Road and Rail

Limerick also has main line rail connections with Dublin and Cork and can be reached from any railway station in Ireland. The main rail stations in the region being Limerick and Ennis.

A network of national roads and other more scenic routes make the region highly accessible for motorists.

Getting to & from Shannon Airport by Bus

It's one of the cheapest ways of travelling and you can get to and from Shannon Airport very easily with Ireland's national bus service Bus Éireann.

Just outside the main terminal, you'll find the various Bus Éireann stops where you can board all services.

Expressway Route 51 offers departures and arrivals directly from within Shannon Airport to the bus station in Limerick City centre. The coaches provide superior comfort and convenience with reclining leather seats, air conditioning, sockets for charging devices, free 4G Wi-Fi and plenty of room for luggage. A return ticket costs €7.30 and you can buy tickets at the self-service kiosk in the Arrivals Hall at Shannon Airport or on the bus itself.

Bus Éireann Route 343 is another regular service from Shannon Airport to Limerick City Centre with 2 stops in the city – the bus station and Henry Street. The service runs every 30 minutes and tickets cost from €8.50.

Airport Taxis

The taxi desk is located in the Arrivals Hall of Shannon Airport. The approximate cost of a taxi from Shannon Airport to Limerick City is €40 - €45.

The Shannon Region

The Shannon Region has main line rail connections with both Dublin and Cork. There are 17 services per day departing from Heuston Station Dublin hourly from 7am each morning and 14 services from Kent Station in Cork starting at 7am daily.

There is a direct bus (Eireagle) from Dublin Airport to Castletroy (near University of Limerick). The service starts at 6am and a bus departs every 2 hours after that until 10pm each night.

The **Big Green Bus** departs from Dublin Airport to University of Limerick, it has approx. 40 services each day at either 15 or 45 minutes intervals.

Travelling from Dublin Airport to Limerick
